SCHOLARSHIP QUALIFICATIONS AND GUIDELINES

The MBTA Kenneth W. Burrill Scholarship is a \$1,500 named scholarship established by the MBTA Educational Foundation, to honor the memory of a dynamic transportation and construction leader who served as past president and long-time advocate of the Maine Better Transportation Association. The scholarship was established in 2008 by the Foundation and will start awarding an annual scholarship in 2009.

Ken Burrill served in various capacities in the construction industry in Maine. He had a long history with H.E. Sargent and affiliated companies, and his last construction job was as president of Bridgecorp. The final portion of his career was dedicated to owning and running his own consultant company, which wove together his various talents, including strong technical skills, and exceptional communications skills. He had a passion for construction, and for raising awareness of the need to improve Maine's business climate through increased investment in Maine's infrastructure. Ken also had a passion for politics, having served as finance chair for some of Maine's most prominent politicians, particularly U.S. Senator Susan Collins, who was a close friend. He also raised money for U.S. Senator Olympia Snowe, and many other Republican candidates running for statewide office.

Ken was a past president of MBTA, and also a past president of AGC Maine. (AGC Maine has also established a scholarship in his name). Ken was the chief fundraiser for statewide highway and transportation bond referendum campaigns for over 30 years. He was also a great writer, and was proud of his liberal arts education, having majored in English at Nasson College. For his leadership, he won many awards, including MBTA's highest award – the Maine Transportation Achievement Award, and the AGC's Major Achievement in Construction Award.

The Kenneth W. Burrill scholarship is available to any Maine resident accepted or already enrolled in a transportation-related program at any post-secondary institution in Maine. Preference will be given to students who have worked in the transportation or construction field, or who have shown other indications that construction is their career of choice.

1. Recipients must meet one or more of the following criteria:
 - Students with a liberal arts background, who have switched gears with an eye toward a career in construction;
 - Students enrolled in an engineering or construction management program at a community college or university, and who have demonstrated the express desire to work in the construction industry;
 - Students who have volunteered or raised money for infrastructure issues in Maine.
2. Applicants are required to write an essay (minimum of 150 words) describing why they wish to pursue a transportation or construction-related career.
3. Applicants must include a transcript or send separately to MBTA, 146 State Street, Augusta, ME 04330.
4. Applications must be **received** by July 30, 2018 for the 2018-2019 academic year. Applications and required documents should be mailed to MBTA, 146 State Street, Augusta, ME 04330, or emailed to cindy@mbtaonline.org. If possible, please include a résumé.
