Transportation Trailblazer Scholarship

SCHOLARSHIP QUALIFICATIONS AND GUIDELINES

The Maine Better Transportation Association (MBTA) is a statewide, non-profit coalition that advocates for funding for Maine's transportation infrastructure. Members include organizations and individuals who plan, design, build, maintain and use Maine's transportation network. The MBTA believes that investment in transportation infrastructure is integral to improving Maine's economy.

MBTA has an Educational Foundation that awards scholarships to Maine residents pursuing transportation-related fields of study. The MBTA Transportation Trailblazer Scholarship goes to a student who may receive the annual award for up to four years, provided the student retains a grade point average of 3.0 or above, and remains in a program leading to a career in transportation or construction.

The scholarship is open to any Maine student who meets the criteria (below), including students already enrolled in a degree program, or recently accepted to one. Preference may be given to students who have worked in the transportation or construction field, or who have shown other indications that construction or transportation is their career of choice. Students who are active MBTA members or family members of active MBTA members are eligible, as are those with an interest in advocating for increased investment in Maine's transportation infrastructure.

1. Transportation Trailblazer Scholarship Criteria:
 - Students must have completed high school or the equivalent, and be accepted or enrolled in a relevant program of study
 - Relevant programs of study include civil engineering, construction management, construction trades, marine, rail or aviation studies, heavy equipment operation, diesel mechanic or similar programs
 - Students with demonstrated financial need are given preference over those without need.
2. Applicants are required to write an essay (minimum of 150 words) describing why they wish to pursue a transportation or construction-related career.
3. Applicants must include a transcript or send separately to MBTA, 146 State Street, Augusta, ME 04330.
4. Applications must be **received** by July 30, 2018 for the 2018-2019 academic year. Applications and required documents should be mailed to MBTA, 146 State Street, Augusta, ME 04330, or emailed to cindy@mbtaonline.org. If possible, please include a résumé.
