
MaineDOT Village Partnership Initiative

The Village Partnership Initiative (VPI) is intended to address **time-sensitive**, **locally-initiated planning and feasibility studies** that occur outside MaineDOT's normal annual Work Plan cycle. The approach is to **study**, **evaluate**, **plan and scope transportation projects** on or adjacent to the state transportation system with MaineDOT as a partner. While MaineDOT will continue to evaluate requests for planning studies and engineering assessments during its annual Work Plan process, the VPI program is intended to be **simple**, **flexible**, **and fast-moving for new economic development** and other high-priority proposals. MaineDOT will respond to regional and local interests, economic opportunities, and safety needs whenever possible, while ensuring the public gets good value for its tax dollars. Municipalities, Regional Planning Organizations, other transportation stakeholders and private entities may request or apply for VPIs. Since MaineDOT already provides discretionary transportation planning funds to MaineDOT's four Metropolitan Planning Organizations (MPO), VPIs are directed outside MPO planning boundaries. The VPI is for **planning activities only and is not intended for project design.**



Purpose and Need Statement

The purpose of the study is to **improve accessibility and safety for all transportation modes** in Fort Kent while complementing local economic development strategies, goals, and objectives. The study will identify transportation improvements that **reduce congestion**, **improve pedestrian and traffic safety, complement long-range land use planning goals, and align with economic goals** for Fort Kent. This study will not only consider roadway safety and mobility issues, but also consider improvements to **active transportation**. It will also look at **aesthetic design features to enhance the village look, feel, and character of historic Fort Kent Village** and anticipate current growth trends and development. The proposed recommendations will be supported by reasonably available local, state, and federal funding.

Assessment of Current Conditions (Completed)

- Analysis of current traffic conditions within the study area
- Identification of bicycle and pedestrian deficiencies, vulnerable uses of the transportation system, and equity concerns
- Character area mapping and identification of existing community assets
- Existing land-use pattern analysis and identification of potential changes based on development projections
- ADA compliance analysis and identification of impacted facilities
- Identification of existing historical and environmental resources
- Development of existing conditions technical memorandum

Project Kickoff Meeting and Safety Audit (Completed)

- Identification of local issues and economic development opportunities
- Site walk and review of existing safety concerns
- Review of previous related studies and planning efforts
- Identification of gaps in existing data and information to be collected
- Development of approach to public outreach

Review Available Data (Completed)

- MaineDOT Traffic Counts and Crash History
- Fort Kent Zoning and Land Use Ordinances
- Historic properties, wetlands, and other environmental resources
- MaineDOT plans for signal upgrades and pedestrian improvements at Main Street/Market Street and Main Street/Pleasant Street intersections

First Public Listening Session (Completed)

- Public engagement is a key element of the Village Partnership Initiative
- Educating the public and soliciting meaningful feedback is essential to reaching consensus and developing recommendations that both meet the Town's needs and are well positioned to leverage grant funding for construction
- Results of safety audit and existing conditions assessment presented, highlighting technical deficiencies and potential areas for improvement
- Site photos and open forum were used to facilitate discussion and generate ideas


Assessment of Future Scenarios (In Progress)

- Intersection and access management improvements
- ADA compliance and pedestrian safety upgrades
- Revised typical sections on Pleasant Street and Market Street
 - Enhancements to "The Mills", a popular local walking route
 - · New multi-use path with esplanade provides increased safety and connectivity
 - Narrower roadway template promotes traffic calming
- Reconfiguration of Monument Square and Hannaford Entrance
 - Monument Square (currently a one-way street) closed to add parking and greenspace at Library
 - Entrance to Hannaford narrowed for improved access management and pedestrian safety
 - Improved pedestrian connectivity between Pleasant Street and Main Street






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




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
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Fort Kent Fish River Greenway

















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










Pleasant Street – Existing Section




Pleasant Street – Proposed Section




